## "Do"s and "don't"s

Exploring the countryside on foot or by bike is a wonderful way to get close to nature. However, the natural environment is fragile and you can help protect it by following the advice below.

Don't light fires. Take rubbish home. Keep dogs on a lead. Don't make unnecessary noise. Don't pick wild flowers. Check the weather forecast before you set out.

When in the forest, please obey warning signs, particularly about forestry work and hunting. The tracks that you are following are primarily for agricultural use. For your own safety, keep well away from agricultural machinery.

If you follow this advice you will be able to fully enjoy the countryside whilst protecting it for future generations.
